

# WELCOME TO GP SACRAMENTAL PREPS

Dear Catechist and Parish Leader,

Welcome to the Catechesis of Sacramental Preps for Children using God's Park digital platform. As expounded in the Catechism for Filipino Catholics (CFC), our faith believes in the seven sacraments as instituted by Jesus Christ and administered by the Church. These sacraments are Baptism, Confirmation, Eucharist (or Holy Communion), Reconciliation (or Holy Confession), Matrimony, Holy Orders (or Ordination to the priesthood or deaconate), and the sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick (also known as Extreme Unction or the Last Rites).

In the GP Learning Plan, the catechist and/or parish leader is given an introductory overview of our endeared sacraments. Since this material is for those children preparing to receive their first reconciliation and first communion, deeper emphases are directed towards learning the richness of the two foremost sacraments, namely, the sacrament of Reconciliation and the sacrament of the Eucharist.

God's Park will be a digital tool to aid the catechists and the candidates for the worthwhile experience of these sacraments leading towards their holy reception of God's forgiveness and love embodied by the said sacraments.

# CATECHETICAL PREPARATIONS FORTHE SACRAMENTS

## Our Beginning: We Are Loved

- God created the first man Adam and the first woman Eve to become his co-helper.
- God created man and endowed him with so many gifts, talents, capabilities.
- The gifts, talents and capabilities are meant to be shared to others.
- Talents, capacities, gifts and abilities are opportunities for one to know one's self better.

- Knowledge of one's self gives one the potential to fight weakness.
- Human weakness was evident when Adam and Eve disobeyed God and committed the first sin. Sin does not come from God but from the willful disobedience of man who abuses God-given freedom.

#### The CATECHIST will:

- Greet the learners with enthusiasm.
- Begin with the PRAYER AND PRAISE: God's Masterpiece Song instructing learners to memorize and sing this prayer.
- Show the BIBLE HUB VIDEO: The Story of Adam and Eve.

**Say:** The video teaches the importance of obeying rules as Stevie would learn. From the Book of Genesis 2: 8-9, 15-25, the story of Adam and Eve began, and how God gave them one very important rule. After the video, write your reflection or positive com-ment in the Pop and Write section.

• Guide the learners to describe God's love and explain why He made them the crown of creation by asking the guiding questions.

**Ask:** How did God demonstrate his love for man? God demonstrated his love for man by creating Adam and Eve who were the first parents. He created man in his own image and likeness. This means that man is a reflection of God. God is good therefore man is good. He also created man as a unique individual, endowed with talents and capabilities.

**Ask:** Why are Adam and Eve the crown of God's creation? Adam and Eve were the crown of God's creation because they were the most precious of all creatures. Crown signifies being ruler for that is one responsibility God gave Adam and Eve—to rule or have dominion over all creatures and to care for them.

**Ask:** What are the unique gifts, talents and abilities that God gave you and how will you use them? Accept all responses. Correct if there are errors. Instruct the learners to make a list and share to their classmates.

- Greet teacher.
- Memorize God's Masterpiece Song, sing and pray it.
- Watch the BIBLE HUB VIDEO: The Story of Adam and Eve in their gadgets.



- Write reflection on video or positive comments in the **Pop and Write** section after the video.
- Answer the guide questions.
  - How did God demonstrate his love?
  - Why are Adam and Eve the crown of God's creation?
  - What are the unique gifts, talents and abilities that God gave you?
  - How are you using or will use them?
- Ask questions to facilitate discussion. Enjoy.

#### The CATECHIST will:

Show and discuss the GODLY TEACHING: What is Original Sin?

**Say:** This is the story of the fall of Adam and Eve. When they disobeyed God, they committed the first sin. Man inherited the stain of original sin which can only be washed away by the waters of Baptism. This lesson ends with two retention guizzes to check whether you have learned the lesson.

• Check for understanding by posing these questions.

**Ask:** What is original sin? Original sin is the sin that Adam and Eve committed when they disobeyed God. It is the sin inherited by all men. It can only be washed away by God's grace be-stowed during the sacrament of Baptism.

**Ask:** What are the effects of original sin? The effects of original sin are loss of God's friendship, lessened ability to love unselfishly, experience of shame, being subject to temptation and damaged relationship with others.

- Direct the learners to play the MINI-GAME: Adam Names 'Em and answer question when they pop up. This can be conducted individually or, for variation, be made into a contest.
- Instruct the learners to play the SAINT LESSON: St. Elizabeth, the Prophet's Mother and ask the learners to reflect on her virtue that they can emulate.

**Ask:** Who is St. Elizabeth and what is one virtue that you can emulate from her? *St. Elizabeth is the mother of St. John the Baptist. Saint John is the cousin of Jesus who baptized him. One virtue that can be emulated from her is trust in God. She trusted God's Word that she will bear a child despite her old age.*

- Play and learn the lesson: What is Original Sin?
- Answer the guide questions.
  - What is original sin?
  - What are the effects of original sin?
- Answer the two RETENTION QUIZZES after the pictorial lesson.
- Play the Mini-Game: Adam Names' Em and answer questions when they pop up.



- Watch the SAINT LESSON: St. Elizabeth, the Prophet's Mother.
- Answer the guiding questions:
  - Who is St. Elizabeth?
  - What are her virtues that you can emulate?

• Give the direction on how the learners will accomplish their MISSION ADVENTURES.

**Say:** You have five tasks to choose from. Click the desired task. Where applicable, the button will activate whether you can take a photo, record an audio or simply send for validation. Or you can simply click the 'I Did It' button after a job well done. Act accordingly, have fun and send.

Once your parents or leader receives a ping, the response can be either of the two: redo the task or your task is validated. Once validated, you are ready for the next task. You need to fulfill three tasks in order to proceed to the next level in the GP app. If you stay on and complete the five tasks, you gain more God-points and earn an extra Holy Collectible for your collection.

• Wrap up the lesson by summarizing the Christian message and assign students their enrichment or exit activities.

**Say:** The Creation Story is a story of God's love for humankind, his love for you and me. Just as he endowed our first parents, Adam and Eve, with talents and abilities, he has given you

unique gifts and capabilities. Just as he called them the crown of his creation,

he regards each of you as his priceless treasure. Feel his love; thank him for all his gifts to you.

For your enrichment/exit activities, complete these final assignments:

- 1. Adam and Eve in Creation
- 2. I Choose To Be Good

• End with the PRAYER AND PRAISE: God's Masterpiece Song and encourage the learners to share this song to their siblings.

## Our First Parents: We Are Fallen

- The talents, gifts, capacities, and abilities of our first parents, coupled with God's grace, are complemented by their discipline to know themselves and fight temptations due to human weakness.
- Belief in God by our first parents is a free response. No one, not even God, forces us to believe.
- Believing is God's gift which he offers in different ways.

- Humans, like the first parents, have misused human freedom and rejected God's offer of love by sinning.
- Our first parents turned away from God in disobedience and pride, thus, rejecting God's friendship. They wanted to be "like God." (CFC, 372)
- To sin is to turn away from God. The original sin inherited from the first parents is washed away by the grace of Baptism.
- Sin has harmful effects on man's relationship with God and with others.

- Greet the learners with enthusiasm.
- Begin with the PRAYER AND PRAISE: Our Father Song and instruct learners to memorize it, sing it and share this prayer song to others.
- Show or instruct learner to watch the KATEKETIKA VIDEO: Learning More about Adam and Eve.

**Say:** The animation video teaches the lesson on obedience. It is based on the Bible story of Adam and Eve and their fall. This is when they disobeyed God and broke his command. At the end of the video, write your reflection and positive comments about the lesson.

• Guide the learners to explain God's gift of freedom or free will given to the first parents and to all men by asking these questions.

**Ask:** What is gift of freedom or free will given by God? God gave the first parents and all humans the gift of freedom or free will. This is the capacity to make good and right choices according to God's will.

**Ask:** What did God command Adam and Eve to do? *God commanded Adam and Eve not to eat the fruit from the tree of knowledge of good and evil.* 

- Direct the learners to play the MINI-GAME: Life's Safe and Danger Zones and answer the questions when they pop up. This can be conducted individually or, for variation, be made into a contest.
- Show or instruct learners to watch GODLY TEACHING: Who are Lucifer and the Devils?

**Say:** In this lesson, you will know who Lucifer and the devils are. Reflect how many good and famous guys have become greedy and turned their backs away from the noble good or end. Lucifer may be such fella. Watch, listen and learn as much as you can. Two retention guizzes will follow.

#### Our First Parents: We Are Fallen

- Greet teacher.
- Memorize the Our Father Song, sing and pray it.
- Watch the KATEKETIKA VIDEO: Learning More about Adam and Eve.
- Write reflection on video or positive comments in the Pop and Write section after the video.



- Answer the guiding questions.
  - What is the gift of freedom or free will?
  - What did God command Adam and Eve?
- Ask questions if there are any.
- Play the MINI-GAME: Life's Safe and Danger Zones in the gadget and answer questions they pop up.
- Watch the pictorial lesson Godly Teaching: Who are Lucifer and the Devils?

• Instruct the learners to watch the 2nd GODLY TEACHING: What is the Fall? and take the retention quizzes after the pictorial lesson. Ask these questions to check for understanding.

**Ask:** Who are Lucifer and the Devils? The Church teaches that Satan (also called Lucifer) was at first a good angel, made by God. And so the devil and other demons were indeed created naturally good by God but they turned away from him. The devil has sinned from the beginning; he is a liar and the father of lies.

**Ask:** What is the Fall? The fall of Adam and Eve occurred when they disobeyed God's command not to eat the fruit of the tree of knowledge of good and evil.

**Ask:** What is the role of the devil in the Fall? Satan or the devil disguised as the snake tempted Adam and Eve to break God's command. He lied to them. He deceived them.

• Show or instruct the learners to watch the DISCOVERY LESSONS: Discovering Path to Reconciliation - Falling to Sin and Feeling Guilty. After the pictorial lesson, guide the learners to apply their learning.

**Say:** You have learned about the Fall, sin and disobedience in this lesson. It is time to apply what you have learned by:

- Identifying ways that cause you to sin.

  Listen to all responses and/or clarify any error.
- Identifying effects of sin

  The effects of sin are loss of God's friendship, lessened ability to love unselfishly, experience of shame, being subject to temptation, hurting of self and/or others.
- Distinguishing good deeds from bad deeds

  Accept all possible responses and/or clarify any error.
- Listing bad habits and making an effort to avoid them. Facilitate open discussion in the class.

- Watch the 2nd GODLY TEACHING: What is the Fall?
- Take the retention quizzes.
- Answer the teacher's questions:
  - Who are Lucifer and the devils?
  - What is the Fall?
  - What is the role of the devil in the Fall?
- Watch the two DISCOVERY LES-SONS: Discovering Path to Reconciliation - Falling to Sin and Feeling Guilty.
- Participate in the class discussion and apply their learning by:
  - Identifying ways that cause them to sin
  - Identifying the effects of sin on each of them.
  - Listing good deeds and bad deeds.
  - Listing bad habits that could lead to sin and how to avoid them.



• Give the direction on how the learners will accomplish their CHURCH LIFE ACTION PLANS.

**Say:** You have five tasks to choose from. Click the desired task. Where applicable, the button will activate whether you can take a photo, record an audio or simply send for validation. Or you can simply click the 'I Did It' button after a job well done. Act accordingly, have fun and send.

Once your parents or leader receives a ping, the response can be either of the two: redo the task or your task is validated. Once validated, you are ready for the next task.

You need to fulfill three tasks in order to proceed to the next level in the GP app. If you stay on and complete the five tasks, you gain more God-points and earn an extra Holy Collectible for your collection.

• Wrap up the lesson by summarizing the Christian and assign students their enrichment or exit activities.

Say: God created Adam and Eve, our first parents with free will but they chose to disobey his com-

mand and they fell into sin. We too have that free will. Let's choose good over evil.

• End with the PRAYER AND PRAISE: Our Father Song, reminding the learners to sing this song during Mass when this is sung and at home before going to sleep.

- The first sacrament we receive is Baptism, the rite of Christian initiation.
- Baptism means new life in Christ, through the cleansing power of water and the Spirit.
- Baptism is a new birth; a birth unto hope which draws its life from the Resurrection of Jesus.
- Baptism is called 'enlightenment' because the baptized receives Christ as the light of the world.
- In Infant Baptism, the believing community stands for the child's request for faith; it is the communal faith that sustains the child's growing faith. The baptized shares this common humanity and shared divinity with the family, relatives and friends.

- Greet the learners with enthusiasm.
- Begin with the PRAYER AND PRAISE: The Great Doxology and instruct learners to memorize it and pray it during Mass.
- Show or instruct learners to watch the BIBLE HUB VIDEO: The Story of Jesus' Baptism.

**Say:** In this animated video, Kristian shares to Patrice and Stevie the story of the Cherokee initiation. He then relates the story to the Bible account of Jesus' baptism by his cousin John the Baptist as revealed in the Gospel of Matthew. Watch, listen and then reflect. After the video, write your reflection or positive comment in the Pop and Write section.

- Lead a class discussion about Jesus' Baptism and ask learners to retell the event of Jesus' Baptism in the Jordan River.
- Show or instruct learners to watch GODLY TEACHING: What is a Sacrament? After the pictorial lesson, check for understanding by asking these questions.

**Ask:** What is sacrament? The sacrament is an outward sign instituted by Christ to give sanctifying grace. According to the Catechism of the Catholic Church, sanctifying grace is the free and undeserved gift of God's divine life and friendship given to us through the Holy Spirit.

**Ask:** What are the seven sacraments of the Catholic Church? The seven sacraments of the Catholic Church are Baptism, Confirmation. Holy Eucharist, Reconciliation, Anointing of the Sick, Holy Orders and Matrimony.

**Say:** We will study all of these seven sacraments this year.

• Show or instruct learners to watch GODLY TEACHING: What is the Sacrament of Baptism? and remind them to listen intently. Instruct them to take the retention quizzes after the lesson.

## Our Baptism: We Are Cleansed

- Greet teacher.
- Memorize the Great Doxology and pray it during Mass.
- Watch the BIBLE HUB VIDEO: The Story of Jesus' Baptism in their gadgets.
- Write reflection or positive comment in the Pop and Write section after the video.
- Participate in class discussion and be prepared to retell the story of Jesus' Baptism.
- Answer the guide questions.
  - What is a sacrament?
  - What are the seven sacraments of the Catholic Church?
- Start to ask questions to the teacher or the class.
- Watch the GODLY TEACHING: What is the Sacrament of Baptism?
- Take the two RETENTION QUIZZES.



• Lead the class discussion on Baptism and its effects.

**Ask:** What is the sacrament of Baptism? The Sacrament of Baptism is the first sacrament of the Church. It is the sacrament of rebirth and cleansing with water and the Holy Spirit.

**Ask:** What are the effects of Baptism? The effects of Baptism are washing away of original sin, infusion of sanctifying grace, renewal of relationship with God and becoming a member of the Church.

**Ask:** What are the baptismal symbols and their meanings? *God showers his gifts upon us through the Sacrament of Baptism. While these gifts are not visible to the human eye, they are understood through the visible, tangible signs used in the Sacrament.* 

**Say:** These tangible signs and symbols are:

- Baptismal water: cleansing from all sin (original and personal sins).
- Paschal candle: the light of the Risen Christ.
- White garment: being a new creation and belonging to the Church.
- Chrism (Holy oil): being anointed and the strength to resist the power of evil.

• Show or instruct learners to play the lesson on St. John the Baptist, the Water Healer.

**Say:** St. John the Baptist was the cousin of Jesus. He told people to repent and baptized them. When Jesus came, John baptized him and a voice from heaven said, "This is my Beloved Son with whom I am well-pleased." Watch, listen and reflect which virtues St. John the Baptist strike you the most-self-denial, obedience, courage and humility? Which one?

## Our Baptism: We Are Cleansed

- Participate in the class discussion and be ready to answer these questions:
  - -- What is the sacrament of Baptism?
  - -- What are the effects of Baptism?
  - -- What are the baptismal symbols and their meanings?



- Draw and describe the baptismal symbols and write their reflection on the symbols of Baptism using the worksheet: Signs & Symbols Everywhere.
- Watch the SAINT LESSON: St. John the Baptist, the Water Healer and reflect on his virtues of selfdenial, obedience, courage and humility.

- Direct the learners to play the MINIGAME: Connect St. John and answer questions when they pop up. This can be conducted individually or, for variation, be made into a contest.
- Give the direction on how the learners will accomplish their MISSION ADVENTURES.

**Say:** You have five tasks to choose from. Click the desired task. Where applicable, the button will activate whether you can take a photo, record an audio or simply send for validation. Or you can simply click the 'I Did It' button after a job well done. Act accordingly, have fun and send.

Once your parents or leader receives a ping, the response can be either of the two: redo the task or your task is validated. Once validated, you are ready for the next task.

You need to fulfill three tasks in order to proceed to the next level in the GP app. If you stay on and complete the five tasks, you gain more God-points and earn an extra Holy Collectible for your collection.

• Wrap up the lesson by summarizing the Christian message. Assign students their enrichment or exit activities.

**Say:** Through this lesson you now know that God renews life through the seven sacraments of the Church. The first of these sacraments is Baptism, the sacrament that washes away the original sin inherited from our first parents. To celebrate this sacrament, look for some family memorabilia of the day when you, your siblings or your parents were baptized.

For your enrichment/exit activities, complete these final assignments:

- The seal of the Holy Spirit marks our total belonging to Christ. Confirmation, like Baptism, imprints a spiritual mark or indelible character on the Christian's soul; it thus, it is received only once. (CCC, 1317)

After the video, write your reflection or positive comment in the Pop and Write section.

• Show or instruct learners to watch GODLY TEACHING: What is the Sacrament of Confirmation? After the pictorial lesson, check for understanding by asking these questions.

**Ask:** What is the sacrament of Confirmation? *Confirmation is the sacrament of Christian initiation that bestows the seal of the Holy Spirit, and marks total belonging to Christ.* 

**Ask:** What are the effects of the sacrament of Confirmation? The effect of the sacrament of Confirmation is the full outpouring of the Holy Spirit in us. It increases and deepens the baptismal grace, unites more firmly in Christ, strengthens the bond with the Church and increases the gifts of the Holy Spirit.

**Ask:** What are the gifts of the Holy Spirit? The seven gifts of the Holy Spirit are wisdom, understanding, knowledge, piety, counsel, fortitude, and fear of God. These gifts help Christians grow in holiness.

**Ask:** What are the fruits of the Holy Spirit? Christian lives led by the Holy Spirit bear the fruits of the Holy Spirit. These are charity, chastity, faithfulness, generosity, gentleness, goodness, joy, kindness, modesty, patience, peace and self-control. The more you follow Jesus, the more fruits you bear.

- A Messiah-God was born in our midst. Emmanuel means: 'God- with-us'.

  The Child-Jesus is the ultimate sacrifice and "offering for our sins," the living symbol of "God's love and our model for sanctity. "(CFC, 476)
- The message of Incarnation is that we must treasure our bodies because Jesus, the Son of God, became embodied like us, that our flesh may become sharers of his divinity. (CCC, 460)
- Jesus' humanity appears as a 'sacrament', that is, making a visible reality what used to be just an invisible hope for many.
- The Magi were revealers of God's salvation for all. They knew how the birth of Jesus will unite all families of believers.
- The Magi followed faithfully the guidance of the star and the divine plan told by an angel. Theirs was a journey of faith.

- Greet the learners with enthusiasm.
- Begin with the PRAYER AND PRAISE: ANGELUS and instruct learners to memorize and pray it with family at 6:00 in the afternoon everyday.

• Show or instruct learners to watch GODLY TEACHING: Who are the Magi? After the pictorial lesson, check for understanding by asking these questions.

**Ask:** What is the Incarnation? The Church calls Incarnation as the mystery that the Son of God assumed a human nature in order to accomplish our salvation in it. (CCC, 461)

**Ask:** Who are the Magi? The Magi are the three wise men from the East who visited Jesus, offered him gifts and worshipped him. The Magi are Melchor from Persia, Gaspar from India and Balthazar from Arabia. They brought gifts of gold, frankincense and myrrh.

**Ask:** What is the meaning of the star? The star represents the star of Bethlehem that guided the Magi to the Child Jesus. It is also a heavenly sign of a prophecy fulfilled two thousand years ago.

- The Parable of the Prodigal Son centers on the healing ministry of Jesus which includes call to repentance and reconciliation, and his compassionate acts of healing and acceptance.
- The prodigal son was restored to his position in the family through robe, ring and shoes and to table fellowship in the joyous feast. He was even reconciled back to his brother.
- In the real sense, the true prodigal person in the story is the Father, who demonstrated the importance of being sensitive to the feelings and needs of others, of respecting others in words and deeds and showing concern for others.
- Reconciliation happens when one converts the master-slave mentality to a deeper understanding of the father-son relationship.

- Greet the learners with enthusiasm.
- Begin with the PRAYER AND PRAISE: The Act of Contrition and instruct learners to memorize, pray this prayer wholeheartedly.
- Instruct learners to watch the BIBLE HUB VIDEO: The Story of the Prodigal Son.

**Say:** In this animated video, Kristian narrates to Alexis the story of the two brothers and their loving father. The story is taken from the Gospel of Luke 15: 11-32 known as the Parable of the Prodigal Son. Watch, listen and then reflect. After the video, write your reflection or positive comment in the Pop and Write section.

• Lead a class discussion about the story by asking these questions.

**Ask:** How do you describe the characters in the story? *Listen and engage all responses.* 

**Ask:** How do you compare the attitudes of the two brothers in the story? The attitude of the older brother/son is pride. Having slaved for his father for years, he developed a master-slave relationship with his father. The attitude of the younger son is humility. Knowing that he sinned against his generous dad, he went back home and asked for forgiveness. He had a father-son relationship with his father.

• Show or instruct learners to watch GODLY TEACHING: What is Sin? After the lesson, check for understanding by asking these questions.

**Ask:** What is sin? Sin is a offense against God and others; a deliberate thought, word, deed, or omission contrary to the eternal law of God.

**Ask:** What are the types of sins? There are two types: mortal sin and venial sin. Mortal sin is a grave sin that destroys charity in the heart of the person. Venial sin is less serious and does not destroy charity and can be restored by an act of love.

**Ask:** What are the effects of sins? The effects of sins are loss of God's friendship, experience of shame and guilt, hurting of self and/or others.

#### The CATECHIST will:

- Show or instruct learners to watch the 2nd GODLY TEACHING: What is the Sacrament of Reconciliation? After the pictorial lesson, ask questions before learners take the retention quizzes.

**Say:** (before the video): When you were playing the game, you were defeating the evil forces by avoiding them, right? In this next video, you will know the best way to defeat those evil forces - the sacrament of Reconciliation.



**Ask** (after the video): What is sacrament of Reconciliation? The sacrament of Reconciliation is the sacrament of forgiveness where the penitent receives God's mercy. It is also a sacrament of conversion, confession, penance. (CCC, 1486)

**Ask:** How is the story of the Prodigal Son related to the sacrament of Reconciliation? *In the story, when the younger son asked for forgiveness from his father and the father forgave him and welcomed him joyfully back to his home. that is like going to confession and asking forgiveness from God. Through the priest, God grants his forgiveness and welcomes the sinner back with much joy.* 

• Show or instruct learners to watch SAINT LESSON: St. Joseph, the Humble Protector.

**Say:** St. Joseph is the foster father of Jesus. He was a simple man who was obedient to God's plan and will. Watch and listen to this lesson about St. Joseph and know his virtues of simplicity and obedience.



- The Parable of the Prodigal Son story brings out God's special concern and unconditional love for the sinner. No sin is beyond the mercy of God.
- It also tells about the human process of acknowledging one's sin and his conversion.

  Conversion is not only an individual act. It likewise involves the process of renewing union with the Church.
- The parable also centers on the healing ministry of Jesus which includes a call for repentance and reconciliation, and his compassionate acts of healing and acceptance.
- In the Church, Jesus touches those who are gravely ill and in danger of dying through the sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick. He gives strength to the ill and restores their spiritual well-being.

- Greet the learners with enthusiasm.
- Begin with the PRAYER AND PRAISE: Prayer of Divine Mercy and instruct learners to memorize, pray and feel the meaning of this prayer.
- Instruct learners to watch the KATEKETIKA VIDEO: Learning About the Prodigal Son.

**Say:** In this animated video, God's mercy and forgiveness as revealed in the Gospel of Luke 15:20, 31-32 shows the loving heart of the father. Kristian and Alexis learn that when Jesus forgives, they can start all over again. After the video, write your reflection or positive comment in the Pop and Write section.

• Review the story of the Prodigal Son with the class by retelling the story and summarizing the lessons learned.

**Ask:** Do you still remember the story of the Prodigal Son? Let's do quick review by:

#### The CATECHIST will:

**Ask:** How is the story of the Prodigal Son related to the sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick? *In the story, healing occurred when the son asked for forgiveness and the father forgave the son unconditionally.*When a sick receives the Anointing of the Sick, healing happens too. Through the sacred anointing, Jesus heals the body and the soul. Physical cure may not happen, but healing does occur with God's mercy.

**Ask:** What is the sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick and its effects? The sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick is the sacrament of healing and comfort offered to those who are gravely ill and are in danger of death. The sick person receives strength, peace and courage to overcome the difficulties that go with the condition of sickness or old age. (CCC, 1520). The sacrament allows the person to be united with Christ's passion. It also prepares the person for the final journey back to God, in the case of those who are dying.

- Direct the learners to play the MINI-GAME: Coming Back Home and answer questions when they pop up. This is can be conducted individually or be made into a contest.
- Instruct the learners to watch the two DISCOVERY LESSONS: Path to Reconciliation Doing Penance and Forgiven & Healed.

**Say:** To continue with the preparation for receiving the sacrament of Reconciliation, watch the Discovery Lessons: Path to Reconciliation, Doing Penance and Forgiven & Healed.

After watching, apply what have been learned by:

- Discussing and reflecting about penance.
   Penance is reparation for sins. These are concrete prayers and actions to show remorse and contrition, ways to restore relationships with God and others.
- Identifying ways how to amend hurt relationships and promote peace. Listen and engage. Correct errors if there are any.

- The miracle of the multiplication of the loaves prefigures the bountiful blessings that spring from the Eucharistic sharing and community.
- In the miracle story, Jesus fed the physically hungry and those hungry for God's Word, giving back to the people their human dignity and worth.
- At the Last Supper, Jesus once more took the bread, blessed, broke and gave it to his disciples, feeding the spiritual hunger of the apostles.
- Whatever little blessing when shared generously will become a blessing and will be multiplied a hundredfold.

- Greet the learners with enthusiasm.
- Begin with the PRAYER AND PRAISE: Prayer Before and After Meals and instruct learners to memorize and pray this wonderful prayer that is often taken for granted.
- Instruct learners to watch the BIBLE HUB VIDEO: Story of the Multiplication of the Bread.

**Say:** Presented in a happy setting, this animation video starts with the God's Park friends sharing a delicious pizza together. The Gospel of Mark 6: 32-44 depicts the story of Jesus' miracle of the loaves and fish, and how he fed the multitude of hungry people who followed and listened to him. After the video, write your reflection or positive comment in the Pop and Write section.

• Lead a class discussion about the story by asking these guiding questions.

**Ask:** What is a miracle? *Miracles are divine events that have no natural or scientific explanations. Miracles come from God alone.* 

Ask: What is the miracle in the story? The miracle in the story is the multiplication of the two fish and five loaves of bread to feed five thousand people. From a situation of scarcity, the miracle of plenty came about.

Ask: What are the important lessons you can get from the story? Possible answers are:

- We can put our "smallness" in Jesus' hands and let him do the rest. He'll make it big.
- For great things to happen, small steps need to occur first like the gesture of the little boy.
- God only asks that we bring our 2 fish and 5 loaves and he'll take care of feeding the multitude.
- Jesus can feed our hunger especially the hunger of our soul.

- Greet teacher.
- Learn to lead the Prayer Before and After Meals at the family table, and make it a habit to say it in their own words.
- Watch the BIBLE HUB VIDEO: The Story of the Multiplication of the Bread.

  - What is a miracle?
  - What is the miracle in the story?

### The CATECHIST will:

**Ask:** What is the Last Supper? The Last Supper is the last meal of Jesus dined with his twelve apostles the night before his passion and death. During this event he offered his Body and Blood and said, "Do this in memory of me" instituting the Holy Eucharist.

**Ask:** How is the story of the multiplication of bread related to the Last Supper? In the story of the multiplication of bread, the boy sacrificed everything that he had so that the thousand people who were hungry will be fed. Similarly in the Last Supper, Jesus is offering his Body and Blood so that all men will be fed eternally. In the Last Supper, he is proclaiming that He is the Living Bread, the Bread of Life. This is the time when he instituted the sacrament of the Holy Eucharist which is also called the Holy Mass.

**Ask:** How will you express gratitude for the gifts received from Jesus? *Listen and engage.* 

• Show or instruct learners to watch SAINT LESSON: St. Charles Borromeo, the Saint of Catechists.



**Say:** St. Charles Borromeo is the patron saint of catechists. He worked tirelessly for the Christian formation of minds and hearts. His virtues worth emulating are "heroic patience and fortitude under vicissitudes, his winning gentleness, his deep humility" and his love for others especially the poor.

• Direct the learners to play the MINI-GAME: Devoted Sling and answer the pop-up Q&As in the game. This may be conducted individually or do a contest.

- In the miracle of the multiplication of bread, the little boy sacrificed all that he had –
   5 loaves and 2 fish to feed the hunger of many.
- Just like the boy, Jesus offers himself constantly in the Blessed Sacrament, and provides abundant blessings to us.
- During Lent, we are called to unite our sacrifices with the sacrifice of Jesus who suffered, and died on the Cross to do the will of the Father and to save us from sins.

- Greet the learners with enthusiasm.
- Begin with the PRAYER AND PRAISE: Prayer of Forgiveness and instruct learners to memorize and pray wholeheartedly.
- Instruct learners to watch the KATEKETIKA VIDEO: Learning More About the Abundant Bread.

**Say:** Presented in a happy setting, this animation video recounts the multiplication of the loaves and fish depicted in the Gospel of Mark 6: 41-44. It narrates the story of Jesus as the Bread of Life, the Blessed Sacrament present at the Mass. After the video, write your reflection or positive comment in the Pop and Write section.

• Lead a class discussion about the story by asking these guiding questions.

Ask: How do you describe the sacrifice and generosity of the boy? The little boy offered everything that he had for the sake of feeding others. He sacrificed and his sacrifice was generous. We can be like him. What we have, though small, we can share to others. God is pleased with these small offerings made out of love and concern for others. The boy is also a model of obedience and humble submission to Jesus who humbly offered his little share of bread & fish as his small contribution to feed the hungry, and Jesus took this occasion to make the miracle.

**Ask:** How do you explain the meaning of the 'smallness' of the boy and his food offering, and how can they become 'big' in the hands of Jesus? Jesus placed value on the little boy and his offering, giving him a sense of human dignity. He used the little body to do something big and extraordinary. Though we may have little, Jesus can multiply it according to his purpose.

**Ask:** How would you describe or illustrate the feelings of the multitude when they experienced the miracle and gift? The people experienced joy, thanksgiving and satisfaction when they received this miracle and gift. It empowers them to become like the boy, sharers of gifts to others.


- Greet teacher.

- Watch the KATEKETIKA VIDEO: Learning More About the Abundant Bread.
- Write reflection or positive comment in the Pop and Write section after the video.

  - How do you describe the sacrifice and generosity of the boy?
  - How do you explain the meaning of the 'smallness' of the boy and food offering, and how can they become 'big' in Jesus' hands?

### The CATECHIST will:

- Show or instruct learners to watch the pictorial lesson, GODLY TEACHING: What is the Blessed Sacrament?
- Check for understanding by asking the guide questions.

**Ask:** What is the Blessed Sacrament? The Blessed Sacrament is the Body and Blood of Jesus Christ, Our Lord and Savior. An hour of adoration before the Blessed Sacrament is an act of love for Jesus and an expression of gratitude for his sacrificial love.



**Ask:** How important is the Blessed Sacrament and why is it important? The Blessed Sacrament is not only important; it is essential for life to be meaningful. With the Blessed Sacrament, we have Jesus, we have true love, we have an intimate relationship with God, we have a well-nourished soul, we can love others in the deepest sense.

• Direct the learners to play the MINI-GAME: Catching Bread and Fish and to answer questions when they pop up. This may be conducted individually or be made into a contest.

• Show or instruct learners to play the GODLY TEACHING lesson: What are Fasting and Abstinence? Check for understanding by asking the guide questions.

**Say:** (before video): We are now in the season of Lent. It begins on Ash Wednesday and ends on Holy Saturday, the day before Easter. As Catholics, you might have often heard about fasting and abstinence. Here's a Godly Teaching video about these two lenten practices. Watch, listen and reflect.

**Ask** (after video): What is fasting? Fasting is a traditional liturgical practice observed during Lent. It means that Catholics aged 18 to 59 can only take ONE FULL MEATLESS meal on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. Meatless meals include fish, seafood, vegetables but not meat of any kind - beef, pork, chicken, turkey and other animals. Some food can be taken at the other regular meal times if necessary, but combined they should be less than a full meal. Liquids are allowed at any time, but no solid food should be consumed between meals.

Ask: What is abstinence? Abstinence is another liturgical practice observed during Lent. This means that Catholics aged 18 to 59 cannot eat meat on Ash Wednesday and all Fridays of Lent. Meat comes only from animals such as chickens, cows, sheep or pigs - all of which live on land. Birds are also considered meat. Abstinence does not include meat juices and liquid foods made from meat. Thus, such foods as chicken broth, consomme, soups cooked or flavored with meat, meat gravies or sauces, as well as seasonings or condiments made from animal fat are technically not forbidden. Salt and freshwater species of fish, amphibians, reptiles, (cold-blooded animals) and shellfish are permitted. (Cf. www.usccb.org)

**Ask:** How will you practice fasting and abstinence of favorite things during Lent? *Responses will vary.*Facilitate and engage. Suggest some favorite things to fast on or abstain from.

**Say:** You have five tasks to choose from. Click the desired task. Where applicable, the button will activate whether you can take a photo, record an audio or simply send for validation. Or you can simply click the 'I Did It' button after a job well done. Act accordingly, have fun and send.

Once your parents or leader receives a ping, the response can be either of the two: redo the task or your task is validated. Once validated, you are ready for the next task.

- The Last Supper was a Seder meal. In this Jewish Passover meal, we remember Moses and how he led the Israelites out of slavery in Egypt. The Holy Mass is like a Passover meal: we remember how we 'pass over' from death to life through Jesus' sacrifice.
- During the Last Supper, Jesus gave his disciples a new command: 'As I love you, so you should also love one another.'
- At the center of the Holy Mass is the story of self-giving love, demonstrating a deep understanding of the importance of care and concern for other people by Jesus himself.
- Just as Jesus 'broke himself' or 'washed his disciples' feet, so we are challenged to do the same for others—to serve others selflessly.

### The CATECHIST will:

- Greet the learners with enthusiasm.
- Begin with the PRAYER AND PRAISE: Prayer of Thanksgiving and instruct learners to memorize and pray.
- Instruct learners to watch the BIBLE HUB VIDEO: The Story of the Holy Mass.

**Say:** The lively animation video portrays a family happily celebrating a Seder meal together. It recalls the story of Jesus washing his disciples' feet and leaving them his new commandment of love during the Last Supper. All these events are taken from the Gospel of John 13:1-5, 34-35. After the video, write your reflection or positive comment in the Pop and Write section.

• Lead a class discussion about the story by asking these guiding questions.

**Ask:** What is a Seder meal? The religious meal served in Jewish homes to start the festival of Passover (Cf. Brittanica).


**Ask:** What is Passover? Passover commemorates the story of the Israelites' departure from ancient Egypt. (Cf. History.com). During the Last Supper, Jesus and his apostles gathered for the Passover feast.

**Ask:** Why was Jesus washing the feet of his apostles? According to the Gospel, Jesus performed a final act of service for his disciples, following the Passover meal. He washed the feet of each disciple, except Judas, who had already left to betray Him. Jesus did this act to set an example—that we are to serve others in the spirit of humility. Even if the work is dirty, hard or inconvenient, we must be willing to serve.

**Ask:** What was Jesus' message to his apostles? At the Last Supper, Jesus gave his apostles his new commandment of love - "love one another as I have loved you."

### The CATECHIST will:

• Show or instruct learners to watch the GODLY TEACHING lesson: What is the Sacrament of the Eucharist? Check for understanding by asking the guide questions.

Ask: What is the Sacrament of the Eucharist and its significance? The Sacrament of the Eucharist is the sacrament of receiving Jesus Christ's body, blood, soul and divinity. It is the summit of Christian worship. The Eucharist is the memorial of Jesus' death and resurrection; the sacrament of love, a sign of unity and bond of charity; the feast in which Christ is consumed and our lives are filled with grace, and; the pledge of future glory that is promised to us. (CCC, 1323). The Eucharist is also the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass or simply the Holy Mass.

**Ask:** What do the bread and wine represent? The bread and wine are food and drink in the Eucharistic meal. They are products of both God-given sources and human harvest or work, signifying that both God and man are at work together. This bread and wine are changed into the Body and Blood of Christ. The Risen Lord is therefore present in the Eucharist under the appearance of the bread and wine.

- Direct the learners to play the MINI-GAME: Get to Know the Mass and to answer questions when they pop up.

  This can be conducted individually or, for variation, be made into a contest.
- Show or instruct learners to watch the video GODLY TEACHING: What are the Parts of the Mass?. Check for understanding by asking the guide question.

**Ask:** What are the parts of the Mass? *The Holy Mass has four parts:* 

- Introductory Rites
- Liturgy of the Word
- Litrugy of the Eucharist
- Concluding Rites



- The Holy Mass celebrates the Paschal mystery of Christ his passion, death and resurrection.
- All Christians gather together and play active part in the Eucharistic celebration, each in his own ways.
- This meant that all who ate the one blessed, broken Bread that is Christ, were drawn into communion with him and with one another, to form one single body with him. (CFC, 1702)
- The meal symbolism of the Holy Mass brings out the sense of joy and oneness with the community of children, enriching our understanding of celebration.
- The Holy Mass is not only an adult celebration; it is also a liturgy for joyful oneness with children. In Jesus' words: 'Let the children come to me.'

- Instruct learners to watch the KATEKETIKA VIDEO: Learning More About the Holy Mass.

**Say:** The lively animation video parallels a happy family dinner with the celebration of the Holy Mass. In the Eucharist, Jesus offers his Body and Blood as he told his apostles in Gospel of Matthew 26: 26-28. Christians gather as God's family to celebrate Jesus' sacrifice and love. After the video, write your reflection or positive comment in the Pop and Write section.



• Lead a class discussion about the story by asking these guide questions.

**Ask:** Why is the Holy Mass a celebration of community worship?

The Holy Mass is a celebration of community worship because it is a gathering of Christians 'breaking bread' together to give thanks to the Father in Jesus Christ.

**Ask:** How are our daily actions fittingly offered during the Holy Mass?

All our daily actions are fittingly offered to the Father along with the Body of Christ in the Eucharistic celebration. The Mass can unify and deepen our ordinary activities by consecrating them to God. Likewise, it is through these very activities that we live out the Mass.

The Easter Triduum celebrates the Paschal Mystery of the Lord Jesus, culminating on Easter Sunday.




**Ask:** Why is Easter the most important liturgical season? *Easter is the most important* season of the liturgical year because it is the celebration of Christ's resurrection. It is the fulfillment of God's promise of salvation that he will conquer death and save us. At Easter, we celebrate God's triumph over evil and sin.

- Direct the learners to play the MINI-GAME: Christian Meals and to answer questions when they pop up. This can be conducted individually or, for variation, be made into a contest.
- Show or instruct learners to watch the video DISCOVERY LESSONS: Sacred Passwords I Confess and Glory to God.

**Say:** Watch the two videos on the Sacred Passwords - I Confess and Glory to God. The sacred password - I Confess is a prayer said during Mass appealing for God's forgiveness for sins committed. Learning the sacred password Glory to God in the Highest is learning to praise God like the choir of angels. Are you ready to learn them?

- In the story, the meal of sharing pertains to the Eucharist, and the celebrant of every Eucharist is the priest or the ordained minister. He gathers the people in worship around the Table of the Lord.
- The Holy Orders is a life of total thanksgiving to God for graces and blessings received from him.
- The Sacrament of Holy Orders is a special ministry where celibate men serve the Lord. Celibacy is an unfolding of the baptismal grace, a charism from Christ himself, a special form of service to others for greater spiritual fruitfulness and availability to the faithful and the Church.

- Greet the learners with enthusiasm.
- Begin with the PRAYER AND PRAISE: Prayer of Divine Presence and instruct learners to memorize and recite this prayer fervently.
- Instruct learners to watch the BIBLE HUB VIDEO: The Story of the Meal of Sharing.

**Say:** Presented in colorful animation video, the God's Park friends teach Gabby the lesson on sharing. It highlights the narrative of the Passover meal of Jesus and his apostles taken from the Gospel of Mark 14:12-26. It is a story about sharing food, drinks, laughter and love. After the video, write your reflection or positive comment in the Pop and Write section.

• Show or instruct learners to watch the GODLY TEACHING lesson: What Does it Mean, 'Do This in Memory of Me? Check for understanding by asking the guide questions.

**Ask:** In the Bible Hub video, what does the meal of sharing pertain to? The meal of sharing pertains to the Eucharist, and the celebrant of every Eucharist is the priest or the ordained minister acting in the person of Christ. He gathers the people in worship around the Table of the Lord.

Ask: What is the meaning of Jesus' statement, 'Do this in memory of me?' At the Last Supper when Jesus raised the bread and the wine turning them into his Body and Blood, he said, "Do this in memory of me". This means to remember his great love for all men. His brand of loving is not just empty words; he puts it into action. What occurred after the Last Supper, his passion and death, is proof of his love. During Mass, when the priest utters this sacred Word, we are to remember Jesus' unconditional love and to share his love to others. Do this in memory of me also means that we must follow the selfless gesture of Jesus in washing others' feet as a symbol of humble service.

**Ask:** What is the role of the priest in the celebration of the Eucharist? The Sacrament of Holy Orders springs from the Eucharist and the priesthood of Jesus Christ. The priest acts in the person of Christ, offers the Eucharistic sacrifice to God as a perfect thanksgiving. He is vested with the responsibility of building up the Church entrusted to him.

- Direct the learners to play the MINI-GAME: Last Supper Preparation and answer questions when they pop up. This may be conducted individually or, for variation, be made into a contest.
- Show or instruct learners to watch the SAINT LESSON: St. John Marie Vianney, the Holy Priest.

**Say:** St. John Marie Vianney is the patron saint of priests. Watch the pictorial lesson and learn from his humility that made him a holy priest and his prayerfulness that drew him close to God. He said, "Private prayer is like straw scattered here and there: If you set it on fire, it makes a lot of little flames. But gather these straws into a bundle and light them, and you get a mighty fire, rising like a column into the sky; public prayer is like that." Are you ready to know more about him?

- The story of the Meal of Sharing exemplifies the virtues of love and service that a Christian couple shares with each other. .
- The Sacrament of Matrimony is a living out of Christ's Gospel which proclaims that true life is found in loving service and charity.
- There are similarities between Church and Christian family. First, both are communities united in love through the Holy Spirit under the sacrificial self-giving of Christ. Second, all parties in both are called to renewal and to grow in loving communion with each other and with Christ. Third, both worship around the table of the Lord. Fourth, both share in Christ's mission of loving charity and service.

- Greet the learners with enthusiasm.
- Begin with the PRAYER AND PRAISE: Prayer of Family Consecration and instruct learners to memorize and pray fervently this prayer.
- Instruct learners to watch the KATEKETIKA VIDEO: Learning about the Meal of Sharing.

**Say:** Presented in colorful animation video, the story of the Last Supper from the Gospel of Mark:14-22-25, Jesus and his apostles shared a special meal. Gabby realizes that to be Jesus' disciples he must learn how to share, even his cookies. After the video, write your reflection or positive comment in the Pop and Write section.

• Show or instruct learners to watch the GODLY TEACHING lesson: What is the Sacrament of Matrimony? Check for understanding by asking the guide questions.

**Ask:** What is the sacrament of Matrimony? *Matrimony is the sacrament of communion between two* people (a man and a woman) in love and God. **Ask:** How is the story of meal sharing related to Matrimony? *In the story, it was emphasized that* sharing is important. In sacramental marriage, sharing is an essential component to keep the bond of love strong and lasting. Without true sharing of self, to one another, the marriage will fall apart.

**Ask:** Why is sacramental marriage a covenant? Sacramental marriage is a covenant because it is a mutual agreement between two persons who make a sacred vow before God and to one another. It is a promise to love until death separate them from each other.

It reflects the story of Christians belonging to a home, the Church. The Church is a family too. After the video, write your reflection or positive comment in the Pop and Write section.

• Show or instruct learners to watch the GODLY TEACHING lesson: What is the Community? Check for understanding by asking the guide questions.

**Ask:** What is a community? A community is a group of people who love doing things together. They bond with each other and they help one another. Your home is a small community made up of you, your parents and your siblings if you have them. There is also your school community comprising of principal, teachers, students, parents and staff.

**Ask:** What is the Church? The Church is a very important community where you and your family belong together with other families, the parish priest and other servants. It is a community of believers and followers of Jesus Christ thus it is called a Christian community.

**Ask:** What are characteristics of a Christian community? The characteristics of a Christian community are, in the words of Pope Francis, harmony, testimony and poverty and care for the poor. - In the Church, there are many parts but it is one body, the Body of Christ.
- The Church is both a mystery and a sacrament. As mystery, the Church is a reality that is imbued by the hidden presence of God. As a sacrament, the Church becomes the visible sign of the invisible reality of God's existence.
- The distinguishing marks of the Catholic Church are not physical but ideal: one, holy, catholic, apostolic.
- With God's divine providence, the Church sustains and strengthens the life of the faithful as the Church withstands the trials and troubles of the world.

- Greet the learners with enthusiasm.
- Begin with the PRAYER AND PRAISE: Canticle of Zechariah and instruct learners to memorize the prayer and share it to their families and friends.
- Instruct learners to watch the KATEKETIKA VIDEO: Learning More about the Home Church.

**Say:** Portrayed in this animation video is the story of the Church as the home of Christians being united in Christ. In the Church, there are many parts but one body as reflected in the Letter of Paul to the Romans 12: 3-8. After the video, write your reflection or positive comment in the Pop and Write section.

• Lead the class discussion about the Church by reviewing the earlier lesson and asking the guide questions.

**Ask:** What is the Church? The Church is a very important community where you and your family belong together with fellow Christians and become One People of God. While the church is often known as the physical structure where we go to Mass, the Church (with the capital C) is the Body of Christ, the community of believers and followers of Christ.

**Ask:** What does it mean - The Church has many parts yet it has one body? The Church is like the human body. It is one body but it has many parts. All of us together is the Body of Christ. And this body, the Church, is comprised of many parts — the Pope, the bishops, the priests, the deacons, the church servants, lay faithful — and each part contributes to the well-being of the entire body.

**Ask:** What happens when one part of the Church is in bad condition? When one part of the body such as the foot is in bad condition, the entire body is affected. It is the same with the Church. When a member of the Church is hurting, the whole Church is hurting too. When a member rejoices, the whole Church rejoices. Each one affects the other.

**Say:** These sacred passwords are sacred words you hear during Mass. Watching these lessons will make you understand their meaning. The next time you attend Mass, you will be able to give the Sign of Peace to the people with the joy of Jesus and say the Under My Roof password with the humility of the centurion. Are you now excited to know more about these sacred passwords?

• Give the direction how to accomplish the learners' CHURCH LIFE ACTION PLANS.

**Say:** You have five tasks to choose from. Click the desired task. Where applicable, the button will activate whether you can take a photo, record an audio or simply send for validation. Or you can simply click the 'I Did It' button after a job well done. Act accordingly, have fun and send.

Once your parents or leader receives a ping, the response can be either of the two: redo the task or your task is validated. Once validated, you are ready for the next task.

You need to fulfill three tasks in order to proceed to the next level in the GP app. If you stay on and complete the five tasks, you gain more God-points and earn an extra Holy Collectible for your collection.
