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

Perspective

Catholic Filipino Youth have relatively high engagement with the Catholic Church

Prospects

The **religious dispositions** of the catechized Catholic Filipino youth is a product of their engagements with Catholicism and shared **human values within the community**

Potentials

Catholicism in the Philippines is expected to prosper in the future because of the continuous work of catechists and the optimism and engagement that the catechized Catholic youth possess

In the end, the paper proposes the notion of Catholic Ethic emerging from the Filipino youth's engagements, which may contribute to further understanding of sociology of Catholicism in the country.

Studies on Catholic Youth and Religiosity

Studies on Youth outcomes vis-à-vis its connection to religiosity and participation in religious activities

Catholic youth committed to religious activities



Lesser probability to commit property or violent crimes, smoke, drink, use drugs, or receive a traffic ticket

Dynamics of faith and religiosity of Filipino Catholic Youth (FCY)



Current youth population of Philippine Catholic Church have remained **firmly rooted in their religious tradition**, have grasped mostly **the Catholic teachings about faith and morals**, have actively participated in normative religious services and, in their own private life, have sought to form a personal relation with God.







Socio-demographic Profile and Economic Context



Most of the respondents know their parish priest and bishop and the consider them as catechists.

Socio-cultural and Religious Experiences



Many of the respondents believe that being **family-oriented** is a culture that **is most influenced by Catholicism**.

Socio-cultural and Religious Experiences



Respondents report that they are generally aware of the influences of Catholicism to Filipino culture.

Catholic Social Teachings and Catechesis

Majority of the catechized respondents are interested in knowing Church-related social issues.

Correspondingly, social media remains to be their main source of information about church-related issues.




Catholic Social Teachings and Catechesis

Although there are awareness programs about Church-related social issues, the catechized respondents are not fully aware of such activities. Given this, half of them believe that the

Catholic Church should be involved in political issues.

Catholic schools remain to be relevant in the catechized respondents' outlooks. They see that Catholic schools aid in promoting the Catholic faith.



The catechized respondents see the following as necessary in making **effective catechesis**:

Perceptions: Selected catechized Filipino youth have high engagement with Catholicism.	 Active participation and celebration of religious services and events Familiarity with members of the community Interest in knowing church-related social issues 	 This shows their dedication in engaging with the church. This familiarity exhibits their belongingness. They long to learn and involve themselves with matters that surround their faith.

Catechized youth respondents perceive themselves as both Filipino and Catholic They see themselves as practicing Catholics They are willing to serve and provide assistance to the church They value virtues and practices that uphold solidarity 	 They are willing to serve and they have the desire to understand their Catholic faith. Their dispositions results from their engagements with their Catholic faith and with their communities. They see the unbreakable connection between their faith and the shared values they see in their communities.

Potentials: Catholicism in the Philippine is expected to prosper in the future because of the continuous work of catechists and the optimism and engagement that the catechized Catholic youth possess	 The catechized youth respondents are optimistic about their views towards the Catholic Church They are willing to undergo catechesis and become catechists in the future They see the necessary help that Catholic schools provide in the perpetuation of their faith. They are generally happy Catholics. 	 This optimism about their Catholic faith signifies a hopeful future for Catholicism in the country. Their willingness to learn and to serve stands as foundation for the future generations of Catholics. Their perceived need to support strongholds (parish & Catholic schools) of Catholic faith indicates their desire to protect and uphold their beliefs in the years to come.

Here, we give the following postulations:

- 1) Catholic ethic is intertwined with culture
- 2) Catholic ethic unites the youth
- 3) Catholic ethic is stimulated by catechism.


Firstly, the Catholic ethic is intertwined with culture because it stems from religious practices that are observed and celebrated by communities. These practices are then etched in cultures, traditions, and ways of living of a community. Accordingly, these traditions, which people in a community share, become part of their identities.

Next, the Catholic ethic unites the youth because it makes them one in their engagements and dispositions about their Catholic faith. Their shared beliefs and human values, supported by their knowledge about their faith, becomes a uniting factor among them.

Lastly, the Catholic ethic is stimulated by catechesis because it is through this that they learn about the fundamentals of their faith. More so, catechesis stands as the primary process by which the catechized youth respondents acquire information necessary about their faith. Hence, catechism encourages Catholicism and engagement with the faith.

Pastoral and Conceptual Insights

The engagement of youth could go further if they are informed and taught about the importance of all Catholic practices.


There is a need to **evaluate** the topics and concepts taught in catechesis.

Lastly, the selected catechized Catholic Filipino youth see that effective catechesis means improving the conditions by which catechists work.

Understanding the experiences of catechized youth provides a glimpse of who the Filipino Catholic Youths are.

In studying Filipino Catholic Youths, looking at their Catechetical Ministry experiences is necessary.

Concluding insights

Their perspectives, prospects, and potentials manifest their high engagement with Catholicism and shared religious dispositions within their community.

The Catholic Youth Ethic which stems from their outlooks on Catholicism provides one angle into understanding Filipino Catholic Youth, and more so, to the sociology of Catholicism

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
